## How to Understand Your Student's Special Education Entitlement Designation for High School Admissions Only

For High School Admissions, seats at each high school program are divided into two groups:

General Education (GE) seats	Students with Disabilities (SWD) seats			
<ul> <li>For students who receive general education instructional programming.</li> <li>For students who receive special education instructional programming for 20% or less of their academic program as indicated on their current IEP.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>For students who receive special education instructional programming for more than 20% of their academic program as indicated on their current IEP.</li> </ul>			

## For DOE and Charter Schools

- ► To understand or determine the percentage of time a student receives special education instructional programming, the school must do the following:
  - 1. Program the student according to the services outlined in the IEP in SESIS.
  - 2. Review the programming on the <u>USPE screen</u> in ATS for accuracy.
    - For DOE schools, the academic periods per week will pull from STARS. Contact your school's FSC's Academic Policy & Systems Lead for assistance with STARS.
    - o For Charter schools, contact <a href="CharterSchools@schools.nyc.gov">Charter Schools.nyc.gov</a> for ATS support.
  - 3. Ensure the student's <u>recommended</u> services from SESIS (in the form of periods per week for SETSS, Special Class, and ICT) matches what displays on the <u>USPE screen</u>.
  - 4. Calculate a percent: the student's <u>actual</u> services in terms of periods, as programmed, as a percent of the student's total instructional periods (e.g. excluding lunch). This should align to the student's service category on the <u>USPE screen</u>.
